5	<sup>7</sup> Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.	<ul> <li><sup>23</sup> Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.</li> <li><sup>24</sup> Ye blind guides, which strain at a gnat, and swallow a camel.</li> </ul>
6	<sup>8</sup> Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.	<ul> <li><sup>25</sup> Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of extortion and excess.</li> <li><sup>26</sup> Thou blind Pharisee, cleanse first that which is within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also.</li> </ul>
